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Comment Scripture The wording for places of teaching and worship shifted over time. While 'Church' and 'Synagogue' stand for concepts in both the Old and New Testament, we find terms such as 'High Places', 'House of KYRIOS', 'Tabernacle', 'Temple' and 'Tent of David' **Prologue** rather connected to Old Testament times. Scripture Comment CHRISTOS delivered the larger [The Sermon in the Mount] Now when He saw the crowds, He went up the moun-<u>Mat</u> portion of His sermons in the tain [a hill on the shore of the Lake of Galilee] and after He sat down, His disciples open - on mountain sides, by approached Him. And opening His mouth He began to teach them ... sea shores or in the streets. They hate the one who reproves in the gate and they abhor the one who speaks <u> Amo</u> Amos was a street preacher. honestly. Then all the men of Judah and Benjamin assembled in Jerusalem [...] All the <u>Ezr</u> 10:9-14 Ezra was a street preacher. people sat in the public square of the House of THEOS trembling because of this matter and from the rains ... All of the people gathered as one to the public square before the Water Gate. They asked Ezra the scribe to bring the book of the law of Moses that KYRIOS had commanded Israel. So Ezra the priest brought the law before the assembly for each man and woman to hear with understanding [...] He read from it facing the public square before the Water Gate from dawn until noon that day, opposite the men, women, and those with understanding. The ears of all the people were attentive to the book of the law. Then Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden podium that had been made for the occasion. [...] Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, because he was above all of the people. When he opened it all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed KYRIOS the great THEOS, and all of the people answered, "Amen! Amen!" while lifting their hands. Then they bowed down and worshiped KYRIOS with their noses to the ground. [...] and the Levites were teaching the people from the law while the people were in their places. So they read the book from the law of THEOS, making it clear and giving the meaning so that they could understand the reading. On the twenty-fourth day of this month the Israelites gathered in fasting, in sackcloths, and with soil on them. Those of the seed of Israel separated themselves from all of the foreigners and stood and confessed their sins and the iniquities of their ancestors. They stood up in their place and read from the book of the law of KYRIOS their THEOS for a fourth part of the day [3 hours], and for a fourth [3 hours] they were confessing and worshiping KYRIOS their THEOS. Then Jeshua, Bani, Kadmiel, Shebaniah, Bunni, Sherebiah, Bani, and Kenani stood on the platform of the Levites and cried out with a loud voice to KYRIOS their THEOS. [...] Blessed be your glorious name that is being exalted above all blessing and praise! <u>Isa</u> 29.21 ... and the scoffer shall come to an end. Thus said KYRIOS to me, "Go, and you must stand in the People's Gate through which the <u>Jer</u> 17:19-20 kings of Judah enter [...] And you must say to them, 'Hear the word of KYRIOS, kings of Judah, and all Judah, and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem who enter through these gates. Then Baruch read aloud from the scroll the words of Jeremiah in the temple of KYRIOS, in the chamber of Gemariah, the son of Shaphan, the secretary, in the upper courtyard at the entrance of the New Gate of the temple of KYRIOS in the hearing of all the people. <u>Luk</u> 9:5-7 IESOUS' disciples were street And as for all those who do not welcome you - when you depart from that town, shake off the dust from your feet for a testimony against them." So they departed and went throughout the villages, proclaiming the Good News and healing everywhere. And while he was holding fast to Peter and John, all the people ran together to them <u>Act</u> 3:11–26 in the portico called Solomon's, utterly astonished. And when he saw it, Peter replied to the people, "Men and Israelites ... John the Baptist was a famous Now in those days John the Baptist came preaching in the Judean wilderness and saying, "Repent, for the Kingdom of the Heavens has come near!" street preacher. John was there baptizing in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance <u>Mar</u> 1:4 for the forgiveness of sins. Jonah became a street preacher. And Jonah began to go into the city a journey of one day, and he cried out and said, <u>Jon</u> <u>3:4</u> "Forty more days and Nineveh will be demolished!" In the third year of his reign he sent his officials, Ben-Hail, Obadiah, Zechariah, Officials of Kings labored Nethanel, and Micaiah, to teach in the cities of Judah; and with them the Levites as street preachers. Shemaiah, Nethaniah, Zebadiah, Asahel, Shemiramoth, Jehonathan, Adonijah, Tobijah, and Tob-Adonijah; and with them the priests Elisham and Joram. And they taught in Judah, and the scroll of the law of KYRIOS was with them when they went around in all the cities of Judah, and they taught the people.
