But Christians surprisingly do not see it as sinful and apply two different standards e.g. when it comes to judge drunkeness and to rarely judge laziness.  Strong's H6102, יצֶּיל, 'âtsêl, aw-tsale, From H6101; indolent: - slothful, sluggard.	Go to the ant, O sluggard; consider her ways, and be wise. Without having any chief, officer, or ruler, she prepares her bread in summer and gathers her food in harvest. How long will you lie there, O sluggard? When will you arise from your sleep? A little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest, and poverty will come upon you like a robber, and want like an armed man.	<u>Pro</u> 6:6-11
	The soul of the sluggard craves and gets nothing, while the soul of the diligent is richly supplied.	<u>Pro</u> 13:4
	The way of a sluggard is like a hedge of thorns, but the path of the upright is a level highway.	<u>Pro</u> 15:19
	The sluggard buries his hand in the dish and will not even bring it back to his mouth.	<u>Pro</u> 19:24

	Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the KYRIOS.	<u>Rom</u> 12:11
Strong's G3576, NW⊕POC, nōthros, From a derivative of G3541; sluggish, that is, (literally) lazy, or (figuratively) stupid: -dull, slothful.	And we desire each one of you to show the same earnestness to have the full assurance of hope until the end, so that you may not be sluggish, but imitators of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises.	<u>Heb</u> <u>6:12</u>
