	A) Bible verses - appearing to speak for Cessationism.					
The Comparison	In Numbers 11:25, we find a one- time occurrence in the Old Covenant [-1446 BC]. Many prophets continued afterwards and still today gifts can be temporal as in this example.	Then KYRIOS came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the SPIRIT that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. And as soon as the SPIRIT rested on them, they prophesied. But they did not continue doing it.	<u>Num</u> <u>11:25</u>			
	No matter if 'the perfect' refers to: A) Human perfection, B) CHRISTOS' Second Coming or rather C) Final Salvation with perfected bodies, a glorious New Jerusalem and a perfect worship towards THEOS, it clearly points to the age after the current age – Eternity. It becomes clear that it cannot point to the time of the Apostles, because 'The Perfect One' had already come and humanity was (and obviously still is) far away from perfection.	Love never ends. But if there are prophecies, they will pass away. If there are tongues, they will cease. If there is knowledge, it will pass away [we still have knowledge]. For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but whenever the perfect [adjective, not noun; TEAEIOC, Strong's G5056; complete (-ness), of full age, man, perfect] comes, the partial will pass away. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I set aside the things of a child. For now we see through a mirror indirectly, but then face to face. 'Law' stands for the Pentateuch, 'Prophets' is meant to denote the remainder of the Old Testament, 'Apostles' is meant to denote the Evangelium & Acts. The gift of prophecy continues today, as visible through Paul's letters. Epilogue

We notice with surprise that many well-educated scholars and teachers share the theology of Cessationism, even though the Bible pre-empties such discussions through the beforehand listed verses and even though most cessationists concede that there is no definitive teaching in Scripture that gifts have ceased - with the consequence that cessationism must be inferred.

Often, a noble thought of criticizing the abuse of Spiritual Gifts is associated with the rejection of Spiritual Gifts, but this is a fundamental error, because the reference for THEOS' truth can never be evil (abuse), but always His perfect will (correct use).

We are to judge and correct those brothers and sisters who abuse Spiritual Gifts, but we quickly assume a heretical and almost blasphemous position if we try to assume the role of the ultimate judge by intending to abolish certain uncomfortable principles and elementary functions of His church.

Christianity was never meant to be a comfort-zone, but a body of Christ where every single member is regularly challenged for growth. Those challenges regularly occur through other believers who use their gifts in order to shape us into perfection.
