Types Of False Teachers	Anti-Christ(s)	<div>The spirit of anti-Christ is also comprised of many false teachers, who were already in the world in John's time and who are among us right now.</div> <div>For many will come in my name, saying: 'I am the CHRISTOS'. And they will lead many astray.Mat 24:5</div> <div>For such people are false apostles, deceitful workers, disguising themselves as apostles of CHRISTOS. And no wonder, for Satan himself disguises himself as an angel of light.2Cor 11:13-14</div> <div>... many anti-Christs have arisen, by which we know that it is the last hour.1Joh 2:18</div> <div>... and every spirit that does not confess IESOUS is not from THEOS, and this is the spirit of the anti-Christ, of which you have heard that it is coming, and now it is already in the world.1Joh 4:3</div> <div>For many deceivers have gone out into the world, those who do not confess IESOUS CHRISTOS coming in the flesh. This person is a deceiver and an anti-Christ!2Joh 1:7</div>
	The Abuser	<div>He uses his status and position of leadership to take advantage of other people. Biblical examples include King Saul who abused his royal power, relentlessly pursuing David out of insecurity and envy, and King David who misused his position to commit adultery with Bathsheba and orchestrate her husband Uriah's death, but then repented and was restored through a painful process. Samuel's sons abused their positions for personal wealth and many teachers of today's church are guilty of similar charges.</div> <div>And it came to pass when Samuel was old, that he made his sons judges over Israel. And these are the names of his sons; Joel the first-born, and the name of the second Abia, judges in Bersabee. And his sons did not walk in his way; and they turned aside after gain, and took gifts, and perverted judgments.1Sam 8:1-3</div> <div>And David sent messengers, and took her, and went in to her, and he lay with her: and she was purified from her uncleanness, and returned to her house. And the woman conceived; and she sent and told David, and said, I am with child. And David sent to Joab, saying, Send me Urias the Chettite; and Joab sent Urias to David. [...] And the men of the city went out, and fought with Joab: and some of the people of the servants of David fell, and Urias the Chettite died also.2Sam 11:4-17</div> <div>... for there did come in unobserved certain men, long ago having been written beforehand to this judgment, impious, the grace of our THEOS perverting to lasciviousness, and our only MASTER, THEOS, and KYRIOS – IESOUS CHRISTOS – denying ...Jud 1:4</div>
	The Charlatan (Prosperity Teacher)	<div>A person who uses Christianity as a means of personal enrichment – usually combined with the promise to bring others into prosperity. See also the Special Discernment on Pentecostalism.</div> <div>... men wholly corrupted in mind, and destitute of the truth, supposing the piety to be gain; depart from such.1Tim 6:3-5</div> <div>For such people do not serve KYRIOS our CHRISTOS, but their own stomach, and by smooth speech and flattery they deceive the hearts of the unsuspecting.Rom 16:18</div> <div>And in greediness they will exploit you with false words, whose condemnation from long ago is not idle, and their destruction is not asleep.2Pet 2:3</div>
	The Divider	<div>He uses false doctrine to disrupt or destroy a church. He generates factions, not healthy unity.</div> <div>For he rejoices in all things which THEOS hates, and he is ruined by reason of impurity of soul. The eye of the haughty, a tongue unjust, hands shedding the blood of the just; and a heart devising evil thoughts, and feet hastening to do evil, are hateful to THEOS. An unjust witness kindles falsehoods, and brings on quarrels between brethren.Pro 6:16-19</div> <div>And I call on you, brothers, to mark those who are causing the divisions and the stumbling-blocks, contrary to the teaching that you learned, and turn away from them ...Rom 16:17</div> <div>... each one of you says: "I, indeed, am of Paul" – "and I of Apollos" – [replace it with Augustine or the Pope] "and I of Cephas" – [replace it with Calvin or Luther] "and I of CHRISTOS". Has CHRISTOS been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized into the name of Paul?"1Cor 1:12-13</div> <div>... in the last time there shall be scoffers, after their own desires of impieties going on, these are those setting themselves apart, natural men, the SPIRIT not having.Jud 1:18-19</div>
	The Heretic	<div>A person who teaches what blatantly contradicts an essential teaching of the Christian faith.</div> <div>Remind [them] of these things, testifying fully before KYRIOS – not to strive about words to nothing profitable, but to the subversion of those hearing; be diligent to present yourself approved to THEOS – a workman not ashamed, straightly cutting the word of truth; and stand aloof from the profane vain talkings, for they will advance to more impiety, and their word will have pasture as a gangrene, of whom is Hymenaeus and Philetus, who swerved concerning the truth, saying the resurrection to have already been, and overthrows the faith of some; sure, nevertheless, the foundation of THEOS has stood, having this seal: “KYRIOS has known those who are His,” and, “Let him depart from unrighteousness – everyone who is naming the Name of CHRISTOS.”2Tim 2:17-18</div> <div>... there will be false teachers among you also, who will bring in destructive heresies, even denying the MASTER who bought them, thus bringing on themselves swift destruction. ... in greediness they will exploit you with false words ...2Pet 2:1-3</div> <div>... our beloved brother Paul – according to the wisdom given to him – did write to you, as also in all the epistles, speaking in them concerning these things, among which things are certain hard to be understood, which the untaught and unstable do wrest, as also the other writings, unto their own destruction.2Pet 3:15-16</div> <div>But I have a few things against you: that you have there those holding the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to cast a stumbling-block before the sons of Israel, to eat idol-sacrifices, and to commit whoredom; so have you, even you, those holding the teaching of the Nicolaitans – which thing I hate. Convert! And if not, I come to you quickly, and will fight against them with the sword of My mouth.Rev 2:14-16</div>
	The Man-Pleaser	<div>A teacher who is rather a man-pleaser than pleasing THEOS. He does rather not care for what THEOS wants, but rather what men want to hear.</div> <div>For there will be a time when they will not put up with sound teaching, but in accordance with their own desires, they will accumulate for themselves teachers, because they have an insatiable curiosity, and they will turn away from the hearing of the truth, but will turn to myths.2Tim 4:3-4</div> <div>For we are not like the majority who peddle the word of THEOS, but as from pure motives – but as from THEOS – we speak before THEOS in CHRISTOS.2Cor 2:17</div>
	The Pseudo-Prophet	<div>A person who is commissioned and empowered by Satan for the purpose of misleading, disrupting and dividing CHRISTOS' church.</div> <div>So KYRIOS cut off from Israel head and tail, palm branch and reed in one day – the elder and honored man is the head, and the prophet who teaches lies is the tail; for those who guide this people have been leading them astray, and those who are guided by them are swallowed up.Isa 9:14-16</div> <div>Then I said, “Ah, KYRIOS, look, the prophets are saying to them, ‘You will not see the sword, and famine will not be yours, but reliable peace I will give to you in this place.’ ” And KYRIOS said to me, “The prophets are prophesying lies in my name. I have not sent them, and I have not commanded them, and I have not spoken to them. They are prophesying to you a lying vision, and a divination, worthless, and the deceitfulness of their minds.” Therefore thus says KYRIOS concerning the prophets who prophecy in my name though I have not sent them, yet they are saying, “Sword and famine will not be in this land.” “By the sword and by the famine those prophets will perish.Jer 14:13-15</div> <div>Look, I am against the prophets,” declares KYRIOS, “who take their tongues and declare as prophets [...] I am against those who prophesy dreams of lies,” [...] they caused my people to err through their lies, and in their recklessness, when I myself have not sent them nor commanded them, so they profit not this people at all” ...Jer 23:31-32</div> <div>‘KYRIOS, KYRIOS, did we not prophecy in your name? And in your name we have cast out demons, and in your name we did many deeds of power?’” But then I will avow to them that I never knew you. Depart from me, those committing lawlessness!Mat 7:21-23</div> <div>“Beware of pseudo-prophets who come to you in sheep's clothing, yet inside they are rapacious wolves! By their fruits you will recognize them.Mat 7:15-16</div> <div>"Teacher, we desire to see a sign from you." [...] "An evil and adulterous generation is seeking a sign. But a sign will not be given to it, except the sign of Jonah the prophet.Mat 12:38-39</div> <div>... brethren, earnestly desire to prophesy, and to speak with tongues do not forbid; let all things be done decently and in order.1Cor 14:39-40</div> <div>I testify to everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book: if anyone adds to them, THEOS will add to him the plagues written in this book. And if anyone takes away from the words of this book of prophecy, THEOS will take away his share of the tree of life and from the holy city that are written in this book.Rev 22:18-19</div>
	The Speculator	<div>His teachings often include novelty, originality, or speculation. Biblical passages are interpreted through biases and assumptions, and biblical stories are embellished according to the preacher's own imagination. This might also imply the prevalent use of extra-biblical sources and repeated references to important teachers of modern history, or of so-called church fathers in more ancient history.</div> <div>And 'Father' you should not call yourselves on earth, for one is your Heavenly Father. [this includes a vast variety of abuses we find in church today, starting with regular references to characters such as Augustine and Ignatius, and going to C.S. Lewis and Spurgeon, a practise widely accepted in church today, but regularly including highly problematic teachers and plainly opposing the prohibition in this verse to do so. We might not call a Spurgeon our father, but we clearly treat him as such and actively work out that future generations venerate such characters even more as their spiritual fathers]Mat 23:9</div> <div>Do not be carried away by various and strange teachings, for it is good for the heart to be strengthened by grace ...Heb 13:9</div> <div>... that thou mightest charge some that they teach no other doctrine, neither give heed to fables and endless genealogies, which minister questions, rather than the administration of THEOS which is in faith.1Tim 1:3-4</div> <div>Turn away from pointless empty talk and contradictions of what is falsely called knowledge ...1Tim 6:20-21</div>
