What kind of biblical relationships should be developed in the church, the Body of CHRISTOS?

The biblical phrase 'One Another' is derived from the Greek word '**allelon**' which means '**one another, each other, mutually, reciprocally**'. Most of the occurrences in the Old and New Testament are specific commands teaching us how (and how not) to **relate to one another**. Obedience to those commands is imperative. It forms the basis for all true Christian community, and has a direct impact on how the world of unbelievers perceives the Christian church and decides if to follow CHRISTOS.

And I do not ask in regard to these alone, but also in regard to those who will be believing in Me through their word, that they all may be one, as You FATHER [are] in Me, and I in You, that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me.

To admit or acknowledge sin <i>fear fell upon them all, and the name of the KYRIOS IESOUS was being magnified, many also of those who did believe were coming, confessing and declaring their acts, and many of those who had practised the curious arts, having brought the books together, were burning [them] before all ...</i> ... <i>the prayer of the faith shall save the distressed one, and KYRIOS shall raise him up, and if sins he may have committed, they shall be forgiven to him. 	Exhort ... Greek - nouthesia. To admonish, advise, correct, exhort and to speak the truth . The basic competence for exhortation comes from knowledge and goodness.	A stone is heavy, and sand cumbersome; but a fool's wrath is heavier than both. Wrath is merciless, and anger sharp: but envy can bear nothing. <i>Open reproofs are better than secret love</i> . The wounds of a friend are more to be trusted than the spontaneous kisses of an enemy. Now if your brother should sin against you, go, reprove him between you and him alone . If he should hear you, you gained your brother. But if he should not hear, summon to you also one or two, so that by the mouth of two or three witnesses, every word might be attested. And if he should disregard them, speak to the Ekklesia. And if he should also disregard the Ekklesia, let him be to you as the nations and the tax collector [exclusion from church]. Judge ... (see also "Don't Judge")	Christians must judge the explicitly sinful behavior of a professing Christian (not the person, but the behavior). We are to confront, call for repentance and discipline such a person in love. This excludes condemnation, rash judgments, personal dislikes, gossiping, trivial matters, taking revenge and/or individual problems between believers.	And if a man is righteous and does justice and righteousness [...] does not lift up his eyes to the idols [...] the wife of his neighbor he does not defile [...] does not approach a woman of menstruation [...] oppresses no one [...] no robbery [...] bread to the hungry [...] not charge interest [...] holds back his hand from injustice and he executes a judgment of fairness between persons, and in my statutes he goes about and my regulations he keeps, performing faithfully - then he is righteous, and certainly he will live," declares KYRIOS. <i>Judge with trustworthy justice, and show steadfast love and compassion to one another.</i> <i>Hypocrite! First take the beam out of your eye, and then you will see clearly to take the sliver out of the eye of your brother.</i> <i>If a man doth receive circumcision on a Sabbath that the law of Moses may not be broken, are you wroth with me that I made a man all whole on a Sabbath? Judge not according to appearance, but the righteous judgment judge.'</i> Now receive the one who is weak in faith, but not for quarrels about opinions . One believes he may eat all things, but the one who is weak eats only vegetables [herbs]. [Paul] It is reported commonly that there is fornication among you, and such fornication as is not so much as named among the Gentiles, that one should have his father's wife. And you are puffed up, and have not rather mourned, that he that hath done this deed might be taken away from among you. For I verily, as absent in body, but present in spirit, have judged already, as though I were present, concerning him that hath so done this deed, in the name of our KYRIOS IESOUS CHRISTOS, when you are gathered together, and my spirit, with the power of our KYRIOS IESOUS CHRISTOS, to deliver such an one unto Satan for the destruction of the flesh, that the spirit may be saved in the day of the KYRIOS IESOUS. Reconcile with ...	To reestablish relationships. 	Don't Lie ...	An untrue or inaccurate statement ; something that misleads or deceives.	Lie not one to another , having put off the old man with his practices, and having put on the new, which is renewed in regard to knowledge, after the image of Him who did create him; where there is not Greek and Jew, circumcision and uncircumcision, foreigner, Scythian, servant, freeman - but the all and in all - CHRISTOS. For "The one who wants to love life and see good days must keep his tongue from evil and his lips must not speak deceit. And he must turn away from evil and do good; he must seek peace and pursue it.

	Don't Slander ...	The utterance of false charges or misinterpretations which defame and damage another's reputation. For I say, through the grace that was given to me, to every one who is among you, not to think above what it behoveth to think; but to think so as to think wisely, as to each THEOS did deal a measure of faith, for as in one body we have many members, and all the members have not the same office, so we, the many, one body are in CHRISTOS, and members each one of one another.
