



Introduction

Prologue

One of the areas of Christianity where presbyters and scholars exhibit the greatest uncertainty, is the topic of biblical age groups. I do not intend to answer all the questions related to this, simply based on the fact that the Bible is not always clear regarding the meaning of certain ages. However, I will point out some – partly very important and not widely recognised– concepts, such as the Age of (Spiritual) Accountability.

It is very difficult for us to discuss the most fundamental concepts of Christianity, especially Salvation, if we have not understood the Age of Accountability, which literally constitutes the difference between Eternal Life or Gehenna up to that specific age.

12	The next step in the life of a believer is the <b>age of 12 years</b> , when a child should <b>actively visit and serve at a church</b> , in the same way IESOUS independently visited the Temple and participated in the Holy Feasts. It is possibly also the age when fasting can be introduced to the child, and a suggested age when a child is mature enough to be baptized.		
	Now IESOUS actively visited the Temple, where He was once dedicated at the age of 40 days. The age of 12 years is also the age of His first recorded words.	And when He was <b>twelve</b> years old, they went up according to the custom of the feast.	<a href="#">Luk 2:42</a>

16-17	On the other hand, 12 still means a age when a person is considered a (young) boy or a girl. 	This age range is not significant, but it is included here in order to underline the fact that <b>people under the age of 20 years are biblically considered as 'young' and 'youthful'</b> . There are no biblical classifications / markers of the ages 18 and 19.		
	Josiah was still considered a youth / boy at the age of 16.  G3808; ΠΑΙΔΑΡΙΟΝ, paidarion; Neuter of a pre-sumed derivative of pais; a little boy -- child, lad.	Josias was <b>eight years old when he began to reign</b> , and he reigned thirty-one years in Jerusalem. And he did that which was right in the sight of KYRIOS, and walked in the ways of his father David, and turned not aside to the right hand or to the left. 	Joseph was at the age of 17 considered as 'young', a translation of the Greek word NEOC:  G3501; NEOC, neos; A primary word, including the comparative (second form); “new”, that is, (of persons) <b>youthful</b> , or (of things) fresh; figuratively regenerate: – new, <b>young</b> .	And Joseph was seventeen years old, feeding the sheep of his father with his brethren, <b>being young</b> ; with the sons of Balla, and with the sons of Zelpha, the wives of his father; and Joseph brought to Israel their father their evil reproach.	<a href="#">Gen 37:2</a>



	Comment	Scripture	
20	The most important age in the life of a human is the <b>Age of Accountability of 20 years</b> , when a person is not saved anymore by default, but is responsible for his or her own salvation. What seems to be a new concept, is easily derived from the following Bible passages and from the importance of the number 20, which is a number that stands for a complete or perfect waiting period. The term 'twenty years old' is found 26 (32) times in the Bible (highly overproportional compared to other ages; only the numbers of 1 / 2 / 3 / 7 years appear more often; see also the addendum with a detailed analysis), clearly underlining the importance of this age.		
	Age of <b>manhood / womanhood / maturity</b> . Children, who will have died before the age of 20 will experience salvation, because they could not yet know ' <b>good or bad</b> '.  If THEOS excluded in -1446 BC children under the age of 20 from condemnation, then He will most certainly do so after the First Coming of IESOUS CHRISTOS.  It would be abstruse to assume the contrary – to assume that innocent children would go into condemnation.	... ‘When a man makes a vow according to your proper value of persons [...] [20–59] for a male from <b>twenty years of age</b> up to sixty years of age [...] [5–19] And if from five years of age up <b>to twenty years of age</b> [...] [0–5] And if from a month of age up to five years of age [...] [60+] And if from sixty years of age and above [...]	<i>Lev</i> <u>27:1-7</u>

	The minimum age for <b>inclusion in a census</b> .	... and they summoned the entire community on the first day of the second month. 	Minimum age for special <b>contribution</b> .	Everyone who is counted from <b>twenty years old</b> and above will give the contribution of KYRIOS.	<i>Exo</i> <u>30:14</u>
	Kings		
	Age of King Josiah to have <b>full spiritual maturity and royal power as king</b> . Josiah was not any king, but he is actually depicted as -the- most righteous king, the only one to fully implement the reforms outlined in the Book of the Law. Josiah's comprehensive covenant renewal surpassed even David's devotion in scale and impact, though both are considered great, righteous kings.  1. Age 8 – Start of his reign 2. Age 16 – Conversion, he is described as 'youth'. The subsequent four years (from 16 to 20) likely allowed him to solidify his personal faith, establish his spiritual authority, and prepare the necessary, probably dangerous, campaign against a deeply entrenched idolatrous culture. 3. Age 20 – <b>Full (spiritual) power and inspiration to remove the high places</b> , in fulfillment of a prophecy made 300 years earlier by an unnamed prophet in 1Kin 13:2, who foretold that a son named Josiah would arise to destroy the idols and the pagan priests at Bethel. 4. Age 26 – Repair of the Temple, which led to the rediscovery of the Book of the Law inside the Temple.	[Age 8] Josias was <b>eight years old when he began to reign</b> , and he reigned thirty-one years in Jerusalem. And he did that which was right in the sight of KYRIOS, and walked in the ways of his father David, and turned not aside to the right hand or to the left ...  [Age 16] And in the <b>eighth year of his reign, and he being yet a youth</b> , he began to seek the KYRIOS the THEOS of his father David ...  [Age 20] And <b>in the twelfth year of his reign he began to purge Juda and Jerusalem from the high places</b> , and the groves, and the ornaments for the altars, and the molten images. 	Age for Levites to <b>fully serve</b> in the house of KYRIOS.	These were the sons of Levi [...] who were to do the work of the service of the house of KYRIOS, from <b>twenty years old and above</b> .  ... the Levites, from <b>twenty years old and upward</b> , according to their posts by their working groups. 	Not coincidentally, the <b>Temple of Jerusalem</b> including Solomon's own house was finished after a construction period of precisely 20 years. 	David's actions clearly prove that children are saved.	... and David said to his servants, Is the <b>child dead</b> ? and they said, He is dead.
