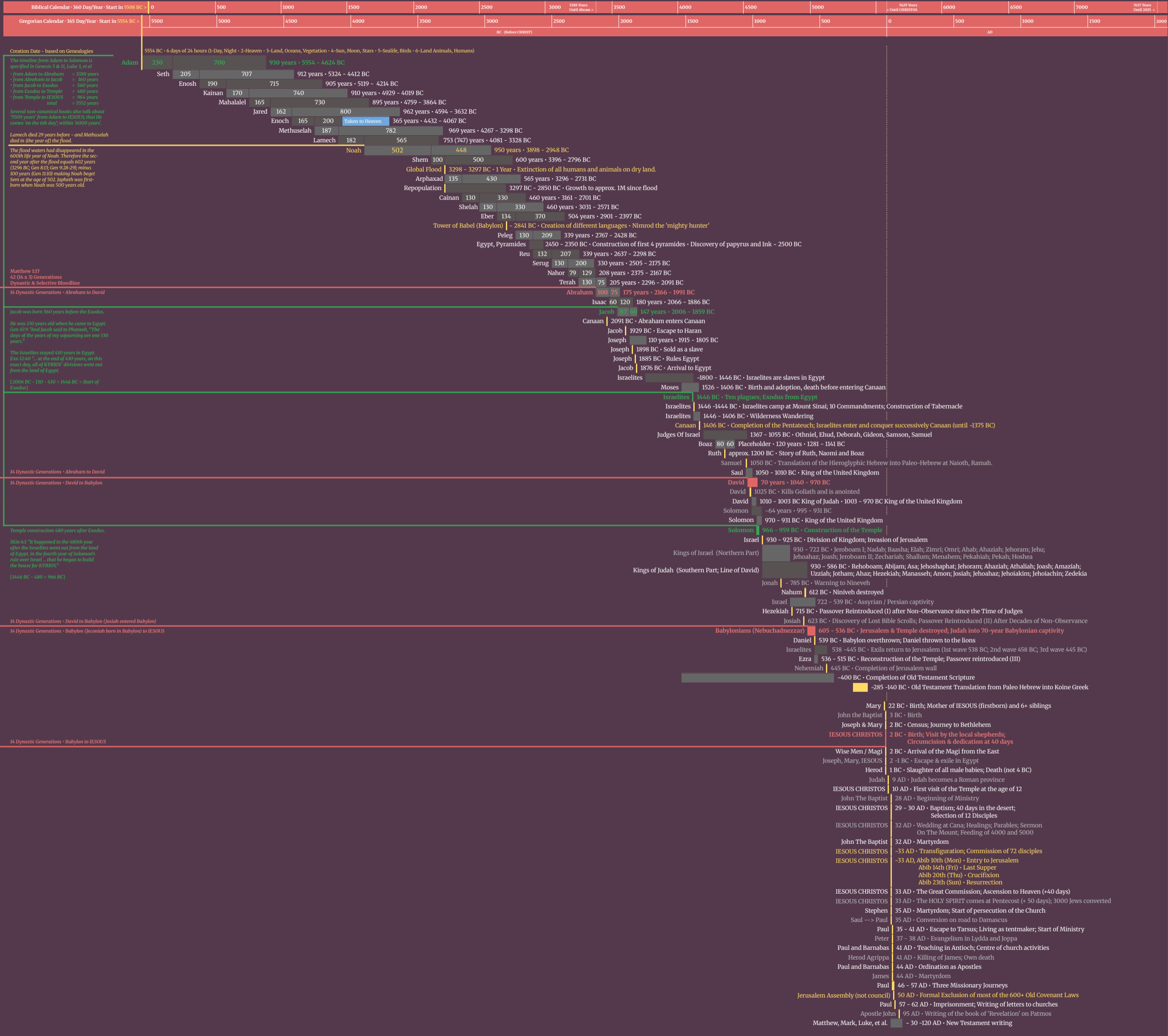

<b>Jewish Diaspora</b> (597 BC - today)	after 135 AD	Syria Palaestina	In the aftermath of the Bar Kochba Revolt, the Jewish people, a once-prominent population in the Eastern Mediterranean, became a dispersed, enslaved and persecuted minority. This revolt had even more catastrophic consequences than the First Jewish-Roman War, effectively depopulating Judea proper, the core of the Jewish homeland, of its Jewish population.  The Romans banned the remaining Jews from entering Jerusalem and <b>renamed the province into 'Syria Palaestina'</b> , in order to complete the disassociation with Jews / Judaea.	-	-
